March 2023 Updates: Refinement of Direct TA Selection Process

This newsletter is supported by the <u>Federal Office of Rural Health Policy</u> (FORHP) to share resources, educational events, and targeted technical assistance opportunities from the Rural Healthcare Provider Transition Project (RHPTP). The goal of RHPTP is to help strengthen the foundation in key elements of value-based care for qualified small rural hospitals and certified rural health clinics.

Updates: Refinement of Direct Technical Assistance Selection Process

The 2022 - 2023 cohort of six small rural hospitals (SRHs) and rural health clinics (RHCs) is well underway. As The Center opens the application for SRHs and RHCs interested in direct technical assistance (TA) next year, we have important updates on the <u>selection process</u> to share. Selection for direct TA is now based on two areas: provider readiness to participate and the need for services. With the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FORHP) support, five applicants will be chosen each year to receive virtual and onsite TA.

Ideal small SRH and RHC applicants are those that demonstrate the highest need and strong readiness for comprehensive TA, through financial stability, and a strong, stable leadership committed to active engagement in all phases of the project, including the application and interview process, where timeliness and responsiveness to any request for additional information is critical to the selection process. While all eligible SRH and RHCs are encouraged to apply, this project best supports candidates that are not currently or have not recently received similar TA. In addition, RHPTP has the greatest impact on SRHs and RHCs without readily available support and access to value-based care (VBC) transition tools and resources.

RHPTP is designed to strengthen SRH and RHC foundations in the key elements of VBC, including, but not limited to quality, efficiency, patient experience, and safety. RHPTP's goal is to guide SRH and RHCs not currently participating in VBC, in preparing for and positioning their organizations for future participation in VBC. Direct TA also includes a financial assessment for VBC and a health equity dashboard.

Lawrence County Rural Health Clinic: Making Big Strides on Their Journey to Value-Based Care

The Lawrence County Health Department (LCHD) is a public health department offering services to the residents of Lawrence County, IL and surrounding communities. As a rural health clinic, LCHD was one of the four organizations selected to participate in the 2020 - 2021 Rural Health Provider Transition Project.

- Hired a psychiatric nurse practitioner, and continuing to expand behavioral health services in the surrounding counties
- Currently applying for a Rural Health Network Grant to purchase a new EHR software that accommodates more measurable data
- Moved into a new building that provides more space and continuity among all departments, and allows for all services to be under one roof which is helping close those gaps
- Implemented chronic care management
- Outreaching to Medicare population to educate them on the importance of annual wellness visits

- Implemented school-based telehealth kiosks that are making a positive impact on the community and population health
- Solidified partnerships within the county
- Clinic now open on Saturdays from 8:00 AM Noon, one to two days per month
