Social drivers of health (SDOH) are the conditions in the environments where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks.

- Healthy People 2030



## Overall population growth in nonmetropolitan counties increased rapidly during 2020-21 due to an increase in net migration




Note: The metropolitan status changes for some counties in 2000 and 2010.


#### The period 2010-20 was the first decade of overall nonmetropolitan population decline





Figure 2. Income and expenses for urban and rural households.







# The Pandemic Exacerbated LTSS Existing Workforce Shortages.


Pandemic employment losses in health care were greatest for nursing care and community care facilities.

Inadequate support

Escalating workloads and administrative burdens

Chronic underinvestment in public health infrastructure

Moral injury from being unable to provide the care patients need

## **Confronting Health Worker Burnout and Well-Being**

- Receive a living wage that includes health insurance and adequate sick leave
- Ensure adequate personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Reduce administrative burdens
- Increase access to mental health care for workers
- Strengthen investment in the workforce and public health
- Build a culture that supports well-being

## What can I do to support my health workers?

- Establish an organizational culture that reflects its mission
- Take care of your own needs before assisting others
- Ask providers what they need
  - Listen to them and act
- Establish systems that provide support
  - Empower providers to lead in identifying and implementing solutions
- Offer generous paid time off (PTO)
- Implement flexible work schedules
- Remind staff about EPO
- Take a health day if you need it!


