
Placed into small groups to complete a Group Project on a topic that they are passionate about in EMS

In 2019 KORH was awarded the Flex EMS Supplement Grant





We implemented CARES Registry statewide through a contract with KBEMS

This also allowed us to have a statewide CARES Coordinator


Currently we have 25% of the states population covered by the CARES Registry





We focused on CPR and AED education across the state







We also was able to help create the Kentucky Resuscitation Academy

This resulted in Jessamine County EMS becoming a Lighthouse Community under the Resuscitation Academy (Seattle)
