Every year, HRSA programs serve tens of millions of people, including people with HIV/AIDS, pregnant women, mothers and their families, and those otherwise unable to access quality health care





The growing incidence of chronic disease in Delta communities poses a threat to the lives, livelihoods, productivity, and economic vitality of the Delta region, and DRA is committed to improving these health outcomes through a number of programs and partnerships.

- **Delta Doctors** boosts healthcare access in Delta communities by assisting non-domestic physicians trained in this country to work in underserved areas.
- **Innovative Readiness Training** collaborates with the U.S. Department of Defense to provide no-cost medical, dental, and optical care to Delta residents through the Innovative Readiness Training program.
- Delta Region Community Health Systems Development Program works with health care leaders and providers to identify their community's health care needs and strengthen health care delivery.
- Delta Region Rural Health Workforce Training Program develops strategic networks to address the need for trained administrative support professionals in rural healthcare facilities, providing training, certifications, and pathways to employment for current and new workers.
