NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF STATE OFFICES OF RURAL HEALTH (NOSORH)

The National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health (NOSORH) was established in 1995 to assist State Offices of Rural Health in their efforts to improve access to, and the quality of, health care for America's rural citizens. All 50 states maintain a State Office of Rural Health (SORH). Although each office varies in terms of size, scope, organization and services/resources provided, each SORH exists to help rural communities in their state build effective healthcare delivery systems. Funding levels and sources also vary; however, each SORH receives a portion of its funding through the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy. With this funding, SORHs are expected to:

- Collect and disseminate health-related information
- Coordinate state rural health resources and activities
- Provide technical assistance
- Encourage the recruitment and retention of health professionals
- Strengthen state, local and federal partnerships.
