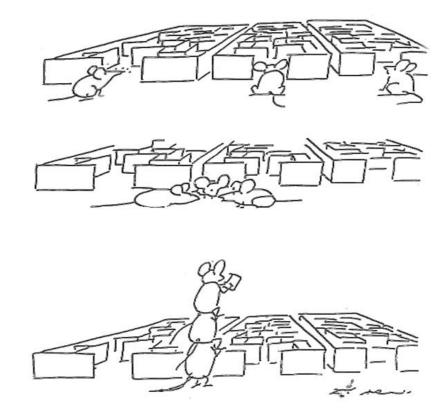






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

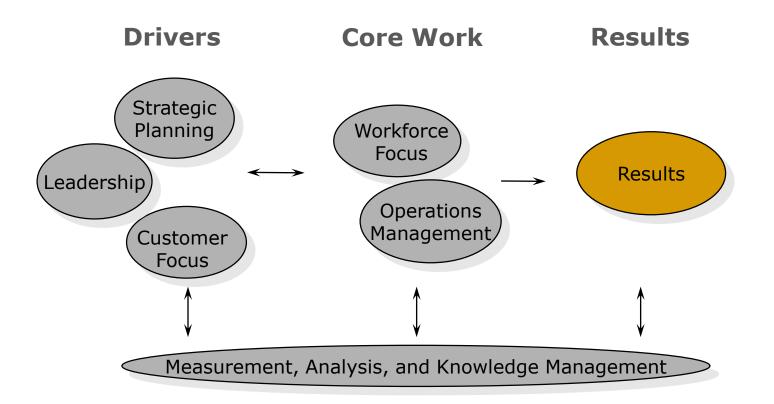


TA Fundamentals

Aim for Impact and Sustainability






TA Methods



Planning

The <u>Rural Health Network Development Planning Program</u> (Planning) has 69 HRSA/ORHP grantees. This is a one year grant program, with grant awards up to \$85,000 per year. The legislative purpose of this program is to expand access to, coordinate and improve the quality of essential health care services and enhance the delivery of health care, in rural areas. The program supports the planning and development of a formal health care network to improve health care delivery in rural areas. This program allows applicants to develop a business or strategic plan, conduct a needs assessment, conduct health information technology readiness and ultimately form a network. Successful grantees often apply for the three-year Network Development implementation grant to continue the work they started under the Network Planning grant.
