- Fall risk assessments

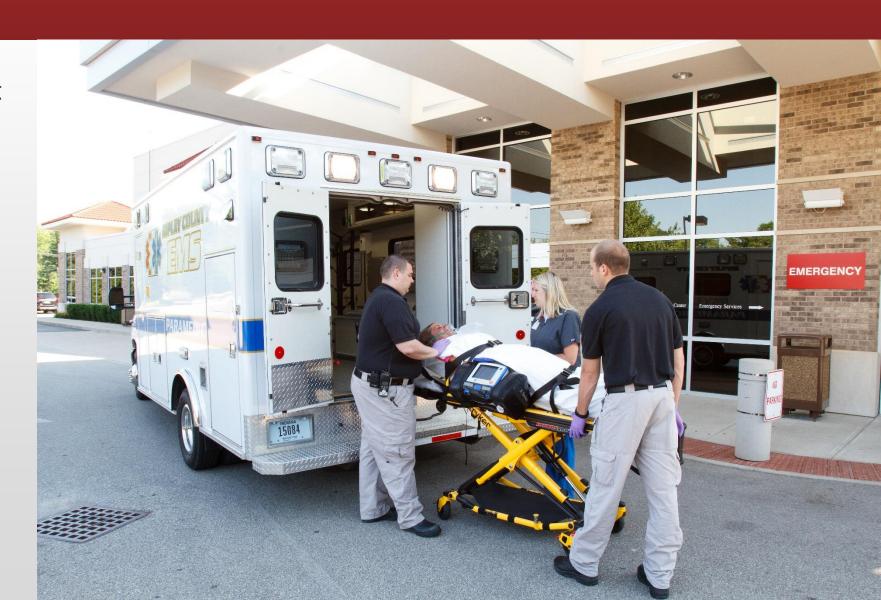


Getting it Right: Improving Patient Outcomes

- Can double or even triple a victim's chance of survival.
