How are services funded ?

- Mental Health Grants
 - Helps to fill gaps in service array
 - Can pay for uninsured/underinsured
- Federal (Medicaid) and the State matching funds.
- County Levy dollars
- Federal Block grant dollars
- Other Grants
- Private pay

WHAT IS MEDICAID?

- Medicaid is a federal-state program
- 1965- companion legislation to Medicare Parts A and B (Title XIX – Social Security Act)
 - The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)
- Entitlement Program (a government program that guarantees certain benefits to a particular group or segment of the population)
- Means tested- children, disabled, etc. (low income)
- The program is also the principal source of long-term care coverage for Americans. (Medicare does not cover)
- As the nation's single largest insurer, Medicaid provides significant financing for hospitals, community health centers, physicians, and nursing homes, and jobs in the health care sector.
- Medicaid covers a broad array of health services and limits enrollee out-of-pocket costs.

- MA is Minnesota's largest health care program and serves children and families, pregnant women, adults without children, seniors and people who are blind or have a disability.
- Most people who have MA get health care through health plans (Manage Care Organization –MCO). You can choose a health plan from those serving MA members in your county.
- Members who do not get health care through a health plan get care on a fee-for-service basis (FFS), with providers billing the state directly for services they provide.

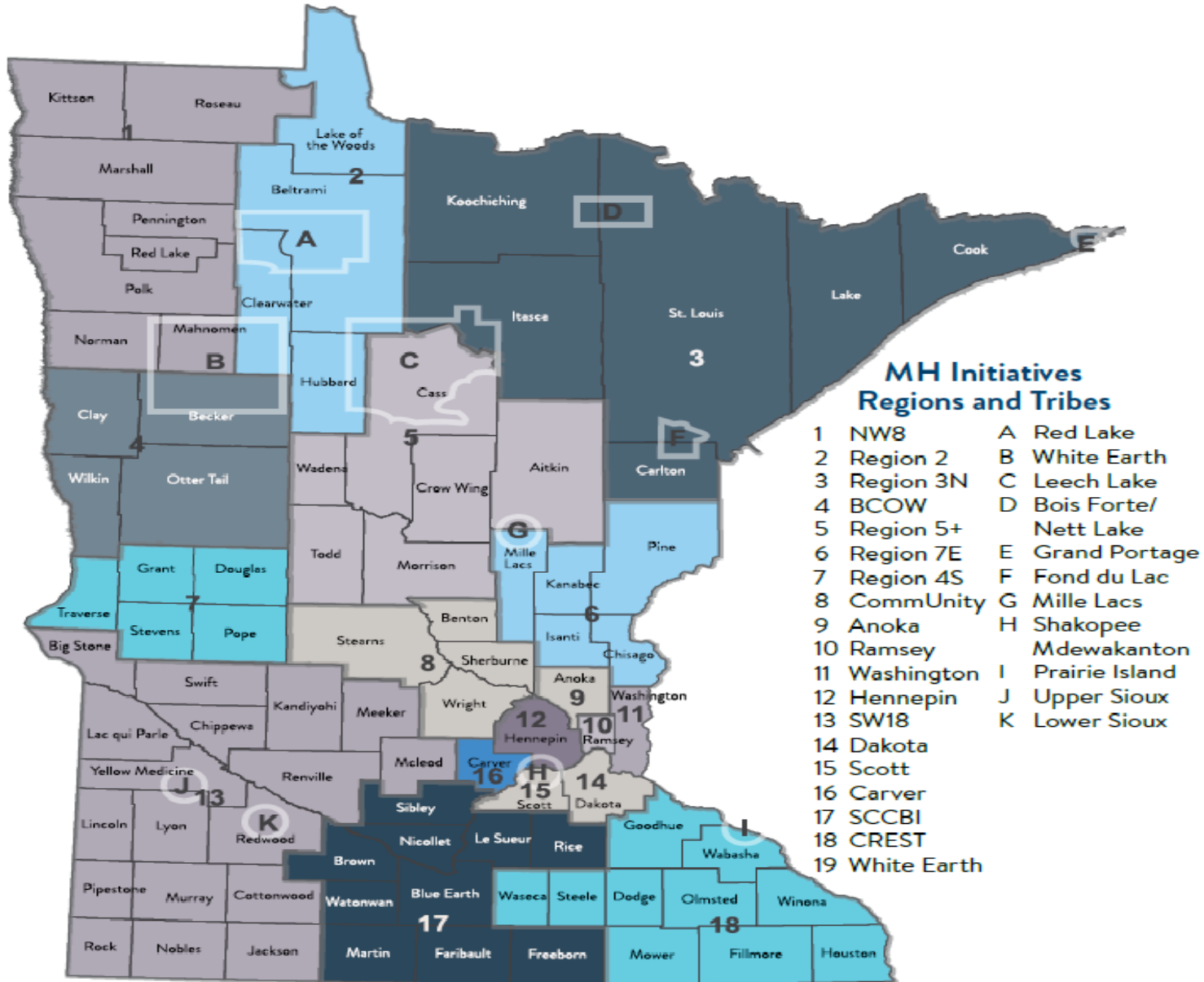
COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH ACT

 - the system would be county-operated and state supervised.

Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) Federal Demonstration Project

Revised: January 31, 2019

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Overview

The CCBHC project is a federal demonstration project that is measuring how an integrated community clinic model of care can improve service quality and accessibility. CCBHCs do the following:

- Provide integrated, evidence-based, trauma informed, recovery-oriented and person-and family-centered care
- Offer the full array of CCBHC-required mental health, substance-use disorder (SUD) and primary care screening services
- Have established collaborative relationships with other providers and healthcare systems to ensure coordination of care

Effective dates for this federal demonstration are from July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2019. For more information, refer to the [CCBHC webpage](#).

Eligible Providers

Eligible CCBHC providers are limited to the six organizations certified to participate in the CCBHC federal demonstration. Participating CCBHCs are enrolled MHCP service providers for all CCBHC services that have been certified as meeting the required [federal criteria \(PDE\)](#) and state standards.

Eligible Recipients

All Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) members are eligible for CCBHC services. "New" CCBHC clients, meaning they have not been served by the clinic in the six months prior to the current service, must meet one of the following to become a CCBHC client:

- Receive a [preliminary screening and risk assessment](#) and one CCBHC service, or
- Receive a [crisis assessment](#)

Since 2012, the Minnesota Department of Human Services has been working with individuals, providers, counties and stakeholders to update our substance use disorder (SUD) treatment system.
